





Directions: Read the following passage and choose the best answers to the questions.

The 'best before' date is often mistaken by consumers to be the same as the expiry date. That's why most of the time, foods that may have passed their 'best before' date go straight in the trash.

Expiry dates tell consumers the last day a product is safe to consume. The 'best before' dates marked on most foods are more about quality than safety. When this date passes, it doesn't mean that the food will be harmful, but its flavor, color or texture might begin to deteriorate. To decide whether food is still safe, people should rely on their senses (sight, smell and taste). Food should not be consumed if the taste, odor, or appearance is odd.

An exception to this is eggs, which have a 'best before' date of no more than 28 days after they are laid. After this date the quality of the eggs will deteriorate and if any salmonella bacteria are present, they could make you ill. If you want to use an egg after its 'best before' date, make sure that you only use it in dishes where it will be fully cooked, so that both yolk and white are solid, such as in a cake or as a hard-boiled egg.
